

NOTICE OF SCHOOL TRUSTEE ELECTION

Parma School District #137
Canyon County, Idaho

Public Notice is hereby given according to law, and the requisite action of the Board of Trustees of Parma School District #137, Canyon County, Idaho, that the annual school trustee election will be held on **Tuesday, May 16, 2017** (third Tuesday in May).

Only those qualified electors residing in Trustee Zone #1 may vote for a Zone #1 candidate, only those qualified electors residing in Trustee Zone #2 may vote for a Zone #2 candidate, and only those qualified electors residing in Trustee Zone #5 may vote for a Zone #5 candidate. The purpose of said election shall be to elect one trustee from Zone #1, one trustee from Zone #2, and one trustee from Zone #5 to serve for a period of four (4) years from the date of the election, one trustee who resides within Trustee Zone #1, one trustee who resides within Trustee Zone #2, and one trustee who resides within Trustee Zone No. 5.

Trustee Zone #1, #2, and #5 are more specifically described as follows:

Trustee Zone 1

Beginning on the west district boundary, which is the Idaho-Oregon state line, at its intersection with an unnamed east-west road located $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to the south of Scott Pitt Road.

North on said stateline and the district boundary to the point where the district boundary departs to the south at US Hwy 20/26.

South on US Hwy 20/26 to Klahr Road.

East on Klahr Road to U of I Road.

South on U of I Road to the point where the city limits of the city of Parma departs to the west.

West then south on the city limits to Hexon Road.

West then north then west on Hexon Road to Scott Pitt Road.

North on Scott Pitt Road to Olson Road.

West then north on Olson Road to an unnamed east-west road located $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to the south of Scott Pitt Road.

West on the unnamed road to the point of beginning.

Trustee Zone 2

Beginning along US Hwy 20/26 at the point where the northern district boundary and the Payette-Canyon county lines depart to the east along Pearl Road.

East on Pearl Road and following the district boundary and said county boundary to the south then east then south then east then south then east to the point where the district boundary departs the county line to the south.

South then west on the district boundary to the point where it intersects US Hwy 95.

North on US Hwy 95 to US Hwy 20/26.

Northwest on US Hwy 20/26 to Parma Road.

North on Parma Road to Walker Road.

West on Walker Road to U of I Road.

North on U of I Road to Klahr Road.

West on Klahr Road to US Hwy 20/26.

North on US Hwy 20/26 to the beginning.

Trustee Zone 5

Beginning at the intersection of Walker St. and 4th St. East in the city of Parma.

East on Walker to Parma Rd.

South on Parma Rd. to Grove Rd.

Northwest on Grove Rd. to 2nd St. East

Northeast on 2nd St. East to 4th St. East

North on 4th St. East to the beginning

As provided by Idaho Code, Section 34-1407 no write-in vote shall be counted unless a declaration of intent has been filed with the District Clerk of the Board of Trustees indicating that the person desires the office and is legally qualified to assume the duties of school trustee if elected. **The candidate's declaration of intent shall be filed not later than March 31, 2017, forty-five (45) days before the day of election.**

The polls will be open from 8:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. **The polling places of said election shall be as determined by the county elections office.**

An elector must be a registered voter who has resided in this state and in this school district at least thirty (30) days preceding the election.

Qualified electors who expect to be absent from the District on **May 16, 2017** (date of election), or who will be unable, because of physical disability or blindness, to go to a polling place, may vote by absentee ballot. Written application for an absentee ballot may be made to the Canyon County Clerk on a form made available at the Canyon County Elections Office, 1102 E. Chicago, Caldwell, Idaho 83605 on Monday through Friday, from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., (six (6) days before the election). Electors applying in person may obtain their ballots starting April 18th (not more than twenty-eight (28) days prior to the election). Electors applying by mail should submit their requests as soon as possible. The absentee ballot must be received by the Clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. on the Friday before the election

Electors applying by mail should submit their requests as soon as possible. The absentee ballot must be received by the Clerk no later than 8:00 p.m. on the day of the election.
